









#### **WELCOME TO THE CLUB**

#### **RECONNECTING WITH LOVED ONES**





#### **LEARN FROM YOUR LIBRARY: LINGUISTICS AND WORD ORIGINS**


Lex obsesses over the etymology of words as a way to distract from her tumultuous life. Read, watch, or listen to these titles to discover the origins behind everyday words and phrases.




# THE ART OF JOURNALING


# ON THE MEETING MENU: A WORLD OF FOOD


