

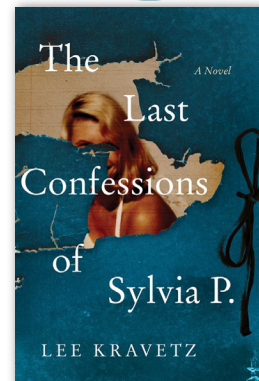

CONFESSIONAL POETRY

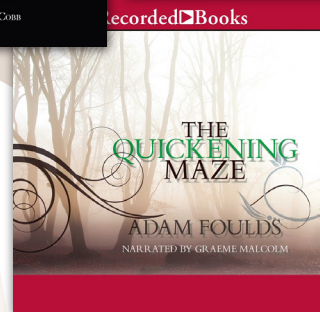
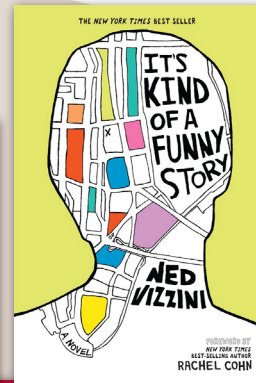
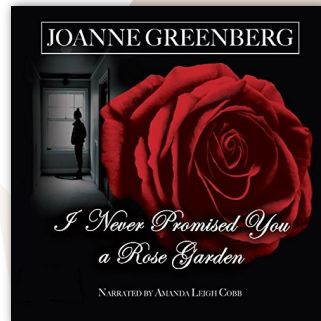
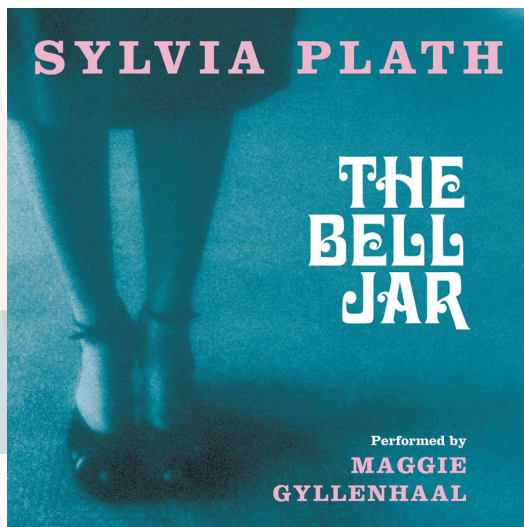
